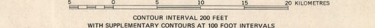

THE HORIZONTAL PROJECTIONS OF THE GREAT CIRCLE TRACKS ARE SHOWN BY THE MOST
TRUE TO THE FACTS FOR THE SECTION OF THE GREAT CIRCLE TRACKS TO BE SHOWN.

TRAIL - Visible on and plotted from high-altitude aerial photographs,
scale approximately 1 inch equals 1 mile. Most visible trails are also
on original land plots or on other early maps. Where parts of trails
are obliterated or are too faint to show on photographs, they were
either plotted as dashed lines from land plots or from other early
maps or omitted. Many minor wood roads and trails are not shown.
A date (year 1864) is generally the date of the original land plot for a
particular township, and all trails in that township are earlier than that
date. All trail names and destinations are from original sources such
as land plots.

EXPLANATION

TOWN - Approximately located, showing other names in parentheses,
approximate date of founding, and largest approximate population in
parentheses. Many newer towns, especially railroad towns, are not
shown. Locations of towns on previous maps vary widely.
RAILROADS - Abandoned and dismantled. Operating railroads are shown
on base map. Most abandoned railroads were same gauge. For more
detail about railroads see Haly (1963).

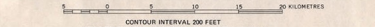
